Dear Parishioners,

Worship Restrictions over the Next Week (26 June – 2 July)

The State Government has today issued a 'lockdown' order, which covers much of the eastern suburbs as well as the City of Sydney. St James' Church is located within this area. This means that we will return to the arrangements that existed at the beginning of last year when there was no congregation present in church and key services were livestreamed.

- This **Sunday, 27 June, the 10:00am Choral Eucharist** will be livestreamed. We will keep the festival of the Coming of the Light, including a sermon by The Reverend Dr John Deane and participation of the Choir.
- Both the Sunday 8:00am Eucharist and 4:00pm Choral Evensong are cancelled.
- On **Wednesday, 30 June, at 6:15pm Choral Evensong** will be livestreamed.
- **Kids @ Church** and **Resting Space** both continue to meet online.
- **Morning Prayer** will continue to be held on weekdays at 8:30am using Zoom Conferencing.
- Other weekday activities including the Lunchtime Eucharists and the Wednesday Lunchtime Concert are also cancelled for this week.

Staff are principally working from home, although one staff member will attend the office each day to collect the mail and clear messages and emails. - **Dobson Organ Factory Fire**

By now many of you will have heard of the fire that destroyed the Dobson Organ Company Factory in the United States. A large amount of material destined for our new organ at St James' was consumed in the blaze. Dobsons have advised us that they are fully insured, and their intention is to continue in business. Discussions will take place once the insurance, legal, and financial matters have become clearer. The Parish is still keen to complete this major project even though it will now be delayed.
