Dear Parishioners and Friends,

COVID-19 Restrictions, December 2021

As of 15 December, a new Public Health Order has mandated a further easing of restrictions in the general community, and for churches in particular.

The following COVID-19 restrictions now apply to churches:

- Both fully vaccinated and unvaccinated people can attend worship;
- Proof of vaccination is not required;
- Masks are no longer required, but are still strongly recommended for people while attending services inside church buildings;
- Congregational singing is permitted without masks;
- There are no density limits in churches (which were previously one person per 2sqm); however ministers, servers, and choir members will continue in the distanced seating pattern until the end of January;
- COVID safety plans are optional;
- QR code check-ins are still required places of worship and for weddings, funerals, and memorial services;
- Weddings are permitted with no person limit – eating and drinking are allowed while standing and dancing is permitted;
- Funerals are permitted with no person limit – eating and drinking are allowed while standing.

Omicron Variant

Despite the easing of restrictions, we are aware of the current spread of the Omicron variant of the coronavirus. While it does not seem to be as fatal as other variants, it is nevertheless highly infectious and therefore spreading rapidly. In response, we need to be cautious in how we respond and therefore encourage parishioners to:

- Be fully vaccinated;
- Stay at home if feeling unwell;
- Wear masks while in the church building;
- Keep appropriate social distancing where possible; and,
- Use hand-sanitiser regularly.

Bicentenary Service – Thursday 6 January 2022 (Feast of the Epiphany)
